SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

CES School Targets:

Math: For Winter Mathematics MAP performance, our overall target will be to increase from 87% to 90% of our students meeting the benchmark.

Strategies for Math:

- 1. In order to impact mathematics performance, CES staff will engage in professional learning from MST (math support teacher) and CES administration regarding data analysis protocols that identify student groups and possible interventions as well as best practices for quality first instruction for these student groups.
- 2. In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will work with MST, TDL (teacher development leader), and grade-level team members to plan and deliver effective first instruction with a focus on critical thinking skills and effective questioning techniques using quality questions.
- 3. Feedback will be collected, reviewed, and analyzed with all CES staff members who are involved in working with students who are implementing interventions and various instructional practices. A template for documentation that addresses the effectiveness of an intervention/instructional practice will be a mandatory component and will be shared.

Literacy: For Winter Literacy MAP performance, our overall target will be to increase from 70% to 74% of our students meeting the benchmark.

Strategies for Literacy:

- 1. In order to impact language arts performance, staff will receive professional learning from the RST on designing formative assessments and analyzing data with a focus on Grades 1 and 2 (Literature and Informational), Grades 3 (Informational), Grades 4 and 5 (Literature)
- 2. In order to impact language arts performance, staff will engage in collaborative planning with the RST and Reading Specialist to generate lessons based upon areas identified in the continuum, for whole and
