Student Device Distribution Update

Distribution of Chromebooks for use in distance learning began Thursday, April 2nd at three sites for high school students for high school students. Middle School and Elementary School Chromebook distribution will start soon. As a reminder, families who requested a device, either through the survey or directly from a staff member or interpreter, will be emailed directly with details on where and when devices can be picked up. Families who have not yet completed the Student Technology Survey are still encouraged to do so. More information about student devices is provided online. If you haven't already heard from HCPSS regarding device pick-up for your child, please remain patient as we work through the logistics and contact families.

Internet Access. Families who do not have internet access may be eligible to participate in the <u>Comcast Internet Essentials</u> program. Those in rural or other areas without high speed internet

service may want to consider activating their smartphone's hotspot feature. We are also working to acquire Wifi Hotspots to support families lacking internet access. Additionally, we are working with our partners to find alternative solutions.

Parents/guardians should check your Canvas notification settings to ensure you are receiving announcements, assignments and messages from teachers.
