As we move forward into our school year and students start to gain more skills with their online platform, we encourage you to leave your child so they can work on their school work independently. Our instructional sessions are meant for the students, yet we do understand that it is important for a parent to be nearby or accessible for technical support. If your child asks for assistance, encourage them to raise their hand or pop a question into the chat box for the teacher to address. This happens naturally in our classrooms and provides the teacher with observational data about how a child learns. We thank you for all you are doing to help your children learn but want to be sure we are encouraging them to be independent as well. Thank you!

As a friendly reminder, we will be having our second day of MAP testing on Wednesday, October 14th, for students in grades 2-8. This week is the math test. The math test will be offered on October 14th at 9 am and at 1 pm. Students may choose to attend either the morning or afternoon session. If your child is

unable to attend, makeup testing will be offered during asynchronous learning times. Makeup information will be shared at a later date. Teachers will share Google Meet information and your student's testing group.

Information Worth Repeating

School Meals

A stopgap U.S. government funding bill signed into law last Thursday, which includes almost \$8 billion in nutrition assistance, allows USDA to extend the meal waivers, previously due to expire at the end of December, through the end of the 2020-2021 school year. Thus, HCPSS will be able to provide meals at no cost to any HCPSS student, and all children 18 and under, through the entire school year, assuming continued availability of USDA funding.

<u>Beginning Monday, October 12</u>, HCPSS will add a snack and dinner to each weekday meal, in addition to breakfast and lunch already being served. Additionally, weekend meals will be included with meals provided on Fridays, and in pre-ordered meals picked up on Thursdays.

HCPSS also has adjusted the pre-order process. Meals for multiple days need to be pre-ordered at least two days in advance for pickup on Mondays and Thursdays. Pre-order meal pickups will be offered only on those two days, to enable Food and Nutrition Services to improve service and efficiency while balancing staffing and food resources.

Schedule Adjustments for Scheduled Early Dismissal Days

The HCPSS 2020-2021 calendar includes four scheduled 3-hour early dismissal days:

- Friday, October 16, 2020
- Friday, November 6, 2020
- Monday, November 23, 2020
- Tuesday, November 24, 2020

The virtual schedules have been adjusted for these scheduled early dismissal days to provide students with synchronous learning for each class. Additionally, both full- and half-day PreK classes will meet on these days using a modified schedule.

Early dismissal day revised schedules for all <u>elementary</u>, <u>middle</u>, and <u>high</u> school grades are provided on the 2020-2021 School Year website.

Technology Tip #1:


Chromebook Split Screen (see 2 windows side-by-side)

Extensions:


Students should <u>NOT</u> be installing any additional Chrome extensions besides the one's HCPSS pre-installed or recommended: Nod, Status, Gopher Buddy, EquatlO, Read&Write, Relay, Texthelp PDF reader, and Tracker for Chrome.

Additional extensions cause disruptions in class and interfere with programs such as Google Meet, Dreambox, & LexiaCore running properly.
