Aspen Family Portal & ER Card system is where you can view your student's grades, attendance, input emergency contacts. Please note - each parent is emailed their own individual Authorization Key Code to their email address, if email was provided. Be sure to use the correct Authorization Key with the correct email login id.

This website is where you sign up to receive email communication and alerts from CES and Central Office. If you submit your cell phone number you can also get text alerts. This is especially helpful when there are early school closings or late openings due to weather events.
