We have officially passed from Summer to Autumn and it's the time of year when the temperature can vary more than 25 degrees from the morning till evening. Light jackets, sweatshirts, or other layers are recommended to provide options for students as the temperature both in and out of the building can fluctuate. Outdoor recess is provided for all students for 30 minutes each day. We suggest that you label all water bottles, jackets and other personal items that may get left behind throughout the school day, with your child's name to make it easier to match the student and their belongings.

### Policy Snapshot- 1040 Safe and Supportive Schools-

Clarksville Elementary strives to provide a safe and nurturing educational environment. strives to provide a safe and nurturing school environment in accordance with Policy 1040:

"It shall be a violation of this policy for any student, employee, or third party to use profanity, or to threaten, defame, harass, intimidate, bully, cyber-bully, or physically attack another when these actions occur on school property, on a school bus, at a school bus stop, or in connection with any school-related activity. These behaviors shall also constitute violations of this policy when they have a direct effect on the order and general welfare of the school (such as negatively affecting the safety or learning environment of a classroom), even when they do not occur on school property or at a school-related activity."

In order to promote safety, it is the responsibility of students to follow the school rules and directions of staff members and to report concerns or suspected violations of this policy to staff or family member so the situation may be properly investigated.

Do you need to report your child's absence? Clarksville Elementary has an email address dedicated to reporting your student's absences. If your child will

miss class for any reason, please use <u>CESAbsence@hcpss.org</u> to inform us. This mailbox will be monitored by front office staff so please include the following information:

- 1. Your child's first and last name
- 2. Grade
- 3. Homeroom teacher
- 4. The dates your child is absent
- 5. The reason for the absence (if it is an illness, please list the symptoms so we can inform the health room)

### **CHANGE IN DISMISSALS**

If you have to change your student's dismissal, please send a note to the teacher. If you have to make the change during the day after your student has come to school, please email the teacher and call the front office on or before 2pm.

### **Update Your Family File**

If you have not already done so, please update your child's emergency contact information in HCPSS Connect! We have 121 families that have not updated their file this year. Your Family file needs to be updated every school year.

Having this information is critical to use for emergency information and early closings. ### K and 1st Grade -




